A native of our beautiful Valley of the Sun, Alice Arredondo was born on December 17, 1939 in Mesa, AZ. Her large family included 5 sisters and 3 brothers.

If you are a native of the Valley, you might remember her family's vegetable farms on University Rd. The Nakatsu family also had a store where they sold their produce: The Nakatsu Ranch Market. As did all of her brothers and sisters, she worked on and off at the store. I assume they never had to hire outside the family!

Alice has 3 children; Jill, Jeff and Mark (OJ), who have given her 7 grandchildren and most recently, Alice became a great grandmother. I can attest, she is very proud of each and every one of them.

Alice attended ASU in Tempe, AZ. (Go Devils.) Her career included banking, bar ownership and management and working for the state in the Department of Economic Security.

Alice has owned 3 bars that had a successful shuffleboard contingency. They were the Oxbow, The Mill Inn and Tiny's Tavern. In addition she managed the CBS, The Purple Turtle and MVP'S at which there were always leagues and tournaments. I remember she thought "outside the box" with respect to promotion and the types of events she would put on! Leagues, draws, Crazy Eights and one day or weekend tourneys. You name it, she did it. The Purple Turtle had a well-attended Saturday night horse collar tournament, for example. Haven't seen it done since! PS-There was always food to be had at these events. We never went hungry!

It was during this time starting in 1981, when she owned the Oxbow, that she began playing. "Not to blame Al Salazar, but he is the one who taught me to play!" In fact, Al taught everyone in her bar to play.

My first introduction to Alice was at the Legion. Gordy and I went down to try our hand at shuffleboard with the big shots! I can remember Gordy and I were talking at a table when we saw Alice and Linda Meyer coming toward us and without a word, they set their purses, drinks and pucks on our table. Without pause, we immediately removed ourselves from the table. As we walked away one of us said to the other that we must have been in the Queen's spot. Little did we know Alice ran everything! Next the pen and paper came out and she's requesting money, a little shocked we promptly gave it to her not even knowing why! Wow! We were officially in our first pea game. Yahoo!!! It went to disaster quickly, but to our surprise we heard Alice say, "we'll see you boys next week." Thanks to her, we kept showing up and Alice became a friend and we had a lot of fun playing shuffleboard with the Queen. Alice loved hanging out with the boys and we loved hanging out with her!!! Alice has a true love for the game and is a big supporter to all of us. Alice is a real fun person and I miss her being out to play. She is a true ambassador to the game and I love you for that Alice.

She also held the positions of President and Vice President of the Valley Shuffleboard League for several years in the 80's.

In 1993 she was founder and director of the Bill Gibbs' Memorial tourney. I found in my research that many people do not know this. She surrounded herself with the best directors and helpers, but this was her baby! This was the largest non-Holiday weekend tournament in the country for 17 years. The only one that Arizona produced in that era! She did this out of a love for Arizona Shuffleboard and of a fondness for Mr. Bill Gibbs; that pompous asshole, Her words, not mine.

She was a founding member of the AZ Shuffleboard Hall of Fame in 1998. Along with Mickey Lewis, Al Salazar, Wendell Herbison and myself. She helped to develop by-laws, forms, the process and the organization. For 10 years served as treasurer, vice-president, president and chairman of the board of directors.

Since 1998 to present, Alice is a lifetime appointee of the Nominating Committee for the AZ Shuffleboard Hall of Fame.

Alice also traveled in the 80's, 90's and early 2000's to Reno, California and Las Vegas tournaments. She has some very funny stories about a trip or two with Robert Price and Sharon Chandler. Pretty sure she used the phrase STFU several times on that one!!

I enjoyed all the memories that my research brought to light over these past couple of months. I am so very happy to have been part of it! There is a lot of love out there for you and we wish you were still out playing with us. A long time coming and so well deserved, congratulations on being enshrined into The Arizona Shufflleboard Hall of Fame. Thank you for the decades of tireless devotion to our Arizona Shuffleboard family. Your love came through. And I personally thank you for everything you did for me!
