

One night a friend named Howard Noble told him if he bought the beer he would show him how to play. After showing Jim he said to practice for about 16 years and he might beat him. 2 weeks later Jim beat the Free Hander and never seen him again.

Maybe 2 years went by and Jim teamed up with Dale Closser and they played at Monty's after work. Dale taught Jim the strategy of the game, and they were hard to beat.

In the spring of 1980 Jim quit playing and drinking, but in the fall he started playing again, he teamed up with Bob Brown and played in the Central Indiana Shuffleboard League (CISL) for about 2 years, then Jim teamed up with Glen (Red) Newland. Red and Jim won the finales of CISL in 1985, and got 2nd in 1986, they also won the State Doubles in 1989. Jim won the State Singles in 1992. Bob Brown and Jim finished 2nd in the only 70 team tournament, that we know of in Bourbon. Glen Ingram and Jim won Bourbon for his only win up there.

He's played a lot of Shuffleboard and made a lot of friends, it's been fun. Jim thinks the tuffest competition comes out of Indiana.
