

Terry Dowell

Terry Dowell first picked up a weight at age nineteen, when his parents put a shuffleboard table in the basement of their newly built home in Inwood. During summer breaks from college at Ball State, Terry and his pals hung out downstairs, playing ping-pong, pool and shuffleboard. They were just games to him, then.

Real life intervened for several years after he graduated, as Terry began a career, married and started a family. There was no time to hang out in bars and play games.

Then, in the early seventies, his Uncle Steve Banic and family friend Bill Niswonger suggested that Terry join their league team. Well, of course, he was hooked, and there was no going back. He took lessons from local great, Bud Broka and practiced shots he learned from watching other players. He developed what worked best for him and began playing in local tournaments.

Thirty-five years after picking up that first weight, Terry is still very much involved in shuffleboard. He participates in the Bourbon-Etna Green and Hoosier Shuffleboard Leagues during for nine months of the year. He serves as tournament director for three or four tournaments held by the Warsaw Eagles each year and plays in most weekend tournaments on the Northern Indiana schedule.

Terry has been a rater for the Bowers' Rating System since its inception and travels to at least one national tournament every year. He has played shuffle-board in over a dozen states and has made countless friends through the years. He encourages new players and is always ready to teach anyone who asks for his help in improving their game.

Terry has made commitments in the form of donations to the State and National Halls of Fame and served as an original board member in Indiana. He has made contributions to the Bowerses and sent in tournament results, photos and articles to the Board Talk when it was the major source of communication among players. He even made a video commercial with John McDermott for Playfair, demonstrating how to play the game.

During those same thirty-five years, Terry has worked for the same employer, helped raise his two children, John and Kim, acquired a wife (Pam), a couple of step-children, Jeff and KC, and six grandchildren. He helps care for his aging parents, volunteers for the local Literacy Chapter and manages to get in a few golf games during the summer.

Although his hair has become whiter, Terry has managed to have a lot of fun playing the game he loves over the last thirty-five years. He's always ready to play a quick \$5.00 draw or a game of Crazy Eights. And that old board his folks bought is still around, too, waiting for a game in the back room of the downtown bar in Bourbon.

Larry Brown

Larry Brown started playing in 1971 at Deer Park Tavern in Ft Wayne where he worked for his parents. His mother was the player and she said, "Throw them pucks". That's all it took for him to be hooked. You usually had to wait for a beer because Larry was in a game.

He learned the game from the old timers that came in, some who were well known, such as Guy & Ray Hall. He played with Bud Esterline, Larry Martin and Larry Deventer during those early years. Sooner or later all of the players seemed to find Deer Park, even the younger ones just starting out like Bobby Voorhis and Bobby Brown Jr. Larry credits Bobby V and Glen Ingram for helping him improve his game the most.

In the late '70's or early '80's, Larry found out about Bourbon, IN and the Spring and Fall Doubles were a must. It was in Bourbon that he met a lot of other players and began having tournaments at Deer Park. He also began going to other tournaments, as many as he could.

His first big (more then 2-3 boards) tournament was sponsored by The Shuffleboard Federation in Ft. Wayne in the '80's and his first long distance tournament was the PCSA in '94 or '95. Since then, he has traveled to California, Reno, Del City and is known by many as the one who never misses a tournament. When Mary set their wedding date for April 24, 1982, Larry made sure she didn't schedule it during the Bourbon Spring Doubles.

Larry worked at Deer Park for 27 years, joined by Mary for the last 16, until 1998, when the bar was sold. He then went to work at an American Legion in New Haven, where he got them started playing shuffleboard and held a successful tournament.

Larry has supported shuffleboard in many ways, promoting The Board Talk and the Indiana Hall of Fame, serving as a rater for the Bowers Ratings System and by helping new players get started, even though everyone knows he hates draw partners! He has won many tournaments over the years with many different partners. Larry just loves the game and hopes to play for many more years.

Larry operates his own vending service and has the good fortune to still be married to Mary for the past twenty-three years. They live with their three cats, Lily, Pooh and Betsy.
